Across these regions, the IRC implements integrated, multi-sectoral programs focused on health, nutrition, WASH, education, protection, economic recovery, and emergency response, serving both IDPs and host communities. With a head office in Abuja and field presence in some of Nigeria's most crisis-affected areas, the IRC is committed to empowering vulnerable communities, restoring dignity, and strengthening resilience. Our mission is to help people regain control of their lives in the face of conflict, disaster, and displacement. We do this through strategic partnerships, community engagement, and data-driven approaches that inform sustainable programming and systemic change.
